We also train local healthcare workers, provide primary health care to children and teenagers, medical care and rehabilitation to sexual and gender based violence victims and provide opportunities for income generation projects.

About us



About Freedom From Fistula

Freedom From Fistula was established in May 2008 by one of the UK's most successful business leaders, Dame Ann Gloag, co-founder of the international transport group Stagecoach plc.

The charity is dedicated to helping women and girls who are injured and left incontinent following prolonged, obstructed childbirth – by providing free surgical repairs for patients already suffering with fistula, as well as maternity care to prevent fistulas from happening at all.

Our main projects are in Sierra Leone, Malawi and Madagascar and more than 90% of our staff are nationals who are supported by international staff and volunteers where necessary.

About our charity Founder

Dame Ann Gloag is a former nurse and co-founder of the international transport company Stagecoach and served as an executive director until May 2000.

She founded Freedom From Fistula in 2008 and has expanded the charity to help more than 20,000 women and children across Africa.

Ann previously helped establish a hospital in Malawi and also founded Kenya Children's Homes in 2002 which now educates and cares for more than 1500 children every year in Kenya.

In 2019, Ann was bestowed the honor of Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire by Her Majesty The Queen, in recognition of her business and charitable endeavours.

Also in 2019, the President of Sierra Leone decorated Ann with the Grand Commander of the Order of the Rokel (GCOR), the country's highest and most prestigious honour, for her support of the women and children of Sierra Leone.

Ann is a past winner of the Businesswoman of the Year Award, European Women in Achievement Award and has won a Great Scot Award for her work with Mercy Ships.

In 2004, Ann was awarded an OBE and, in 2009, was admitted into the Order of the Star of Africa with the grade of Commander, in recognition of her support for the people and the country of Liberia.

She also received the inaugural Susan B. Anthony Humanitarian Award from the National Council of Women of the United States at the United Nations in 2010 and the Eleanor Roosevelt Val-Kil Medal in 2011. In March 2013, Ann was named Global Woman of the Year by the St Andrews Society of the State of New York.

Our impact



Fistula Care

Freedom From Fistula helps **1000+** patients per year providing fistula surgery, patient ambassador training, patient rehabilitation and family planning.

Maternity

Freedom From Fistula delivers **4000+** babies per year and provides pre and post natal care, safe deliveries, health education and family planning.

Children and Teenagers

Freedom From Fistula sees **20,000+** patients per year and provides primary health care, immunisations, skills training and parenting classes to children and teenagers.

Education and Empowerment

Freedom From Fistula educates **1300+** patients per year in literacy and numeracy, health education and small enterprise training.

Training

Freedom From Fistula trains **100+** individuals per year to help strengthen health systems, provides medical staff training, community education and compassionate care.

Sexual and Gender Based Violence

Freedom From Fistula treats **50+** patients per year and provides medical care, counselling services, social work support and rehabilitation to victims of sexual and gender based violence.



Our centers



Sierra Leone

The Aberdeen Women's (AWC) Centre in Freetown provides the only comprehensive fistula repair service in Sierra Leone and has the capacity to treat up to **300** fistula patients per year.

The Centre takes a holistic approach to the care of women and children and in 2010 opened its own maternity unit to provide the highest standards of maternal healthcare for the women of Sierra Leone, thus preventing the occurrence of obstetric fistula in the first instance and ensuring a safe environment for childbirth.

The Maternity is now the second busiest in Sierra Leone, delivering up to **3,000** babies each year.

The AWC also runs an outpatient children's clinic which treats more than **20,000** children each year, providing a primary care facility for children in the surrounding community aged 15 and under, including immunizations and health education. The paediatric team also provides a twice weekly outreach clinic in the Kroo Bay slum of Freetown, providing much needed primary care to the most disadvantaged children.

The Aberdeen Women's Centre is a self-contained facility and more than 90% of the staff are Sierra Leone nationals.

Supported by the Aminata Maternal Foundation (AMF), the Aberdeen Women's Centre runs the Dream Girls program that provides wraparound support to vulnerable and destitute teenage girls before, during and after childbirth. In addition to support from a dedicated counsellor, the girls attend classes in health education and how to look after their babies, as well as literacy and numeracy and support their return to school.

AMF also supports the Skills Development Training program for **60** girls each year where they learn skills that will help them to gain employment or set up their own businesses including, tailoring, hairdressing, cooking and housekeeping.



Our centers



Malawi

We launched fistula care services in Malawi in 2010 before opening our own, stand-alone Fistula Care Centre (FCC) in 2012, in the grounds of Bwaila Hospital in Lilongwe.

This 35-bed unit has its own dedicated operating theatre and the capacity to treat more than **400** women every year, many of whom are found through our Ambassador and community sensitization programs that ensure women and girls from across Malawi have access to our permanent service.

Our holistic approach to our patients encompasses a patient rehabilitation, education and empowerment program that includes access to micro-finance, literacy and numeracy classes, as well as lessons in arts and crafts.

In partnership with UNFPA Malawi, we also run a capacity building program, training Clinical Officers and nurses from target districts to identify, screen and refer fistula patients. This program also funds the training of three Clinical Officers in key districts to perform simple fistula surgeries, with all moderate and complex cases still referred to our Fistula Care Centre in Lilongwe. This is an ongoing program that ensures continuous training and assessment of the Clinical Officers.

Our Ambassador program has been a huge success in the last few years with more than **250** former patients or their family members acting as FFF Ambassadors in their communities, bringing almost 50% of our patients each year.

In order to help prevent fistulas from happening, FFF also funds access to maternal healthcare at two partner hospitals – Mtengowantenga Catholic Hospital and Achikondi Community Clinic. An average of **160** babies are safely delivered each month thanks to this financial support.

Additionally, with funding from Rotary International, FFF supported the training of Nurse Midwife Technicians in order to help build capacity in maternal healthcare in Malawi.



Our centers



Madagascar

We have a dedicated fistula unit in the grounds of CHUT Hospital Toamasina with a capacity to treat **400** fistula patients a year.

We seek to provide the highest standard of care for fistula patients in Madagascar, in addition to raising awareness of the issue in the country. We provide surgical services to heal fistulas, as well as high quality pre and post operative care, raising awareness through media and community sensitization and training local healthcare workers, including Clinical Officers and nurses, so as to help build capacity in the overall healthcare infrastructure.

Our holistic approach to our patients encompasses a patient rehabilitation, education and empowerment program that includes access to family planning, business training, literacy and numeracy classes, as well as lessons in arts and crafts, all of which is designed to help them break their cycle of poverty and reintegrate into society with future opportunities.
